This month's featured Childcare is Smith Memorial in Kalispell!

Smith Memorial Daycare has been in Kalispell for 50 years, upstairs in the

Epworth Church. They started out watching children for many of the current childcare providers in town! Tammy Braseth has been the director for 30 years and has a wonderful commitment to children and families. When the kids attend daycare here, the staff take care of them and love them as if they were their own kids. Currently they serve 2 year old's up to 5 year old's. They serve hot lunches, a morning snack, and afternoon snack everyday, and everything is homemade in our onsite kitchen. One lunch the kids like is a soup called Zoom to the Moon and it is actually split pea soup. Sometimes you have to give something a different name for the kids to try it. They teach kids colors, numbers, social skills, and the alphabet to help them get ready for kindergarten. They also work on name recognition and having children write their names. In the summer they offer swim lessons and vacation bible school. Patty, a volunteer, comes one day every week to teach kids a bible lesson.

She also she helps with the Christmas program they do every year, in which the 5 year old's get to act out the Christmas story. Smith Memorial also has another volunteer who comes one day every week to read the children stories. The kids love to play outside in the sand in on all the wonderful climbing equipment in the yard. The children love practicing using their muscles on out monkey bars, playing with dump trucks and buckets in the sand. The staff is rich in culture and diversity teaching the children to love and respect everyone.

Cheap and Healthy Salmon Cakes

Salmon cakes are pretty quick and easy to make and kids generally like them and they can help with mixing all the ingredients up! Here is a recipe:

2 cups salmon, cooked (fresh, canned, or frozen)

3/4 cup bread crumbs 1/2 cup fresh parsley or cilantro, chopped

> 2 eggs, beaten 2 scallions, chopped 1 garlic clove, minced 1 tbsp. olive oil

Dressing for Dipping

1 cup whole fat Greek yogurt 1 tablespoons fresh lemon juice 1 garlic cloves, minced 1 tbsp. fresh dill, chopped Salt and pepper, to taste

Mix salmon, bread crumbs, parsley, eggs, green onions, garlic powder together in a large bowl; divide and shape into eight patties. Heat enough olive oil in a large skillet to cover the cooking surface over medium heat.Fry salmon patties in batches until browned, 1/2 cup diced seedless cucumber 5 to 7 minutes per side. Repeat with more olive oil, as needed. While salmon cakes cook, make yogurt dressing.In a medium bowl, combine Greek yogurt, cucumber, lemon juice, garlic, and dill. Stir until well combined. Taste and

season with salt and pepper.
